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STATE PENSION AND RETIREMENT LEGISLATION IN 2009

Legislation Introduced January 1 – March 4, 2009 With Its Status on March 4, 2009

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This report consists of a selection of pensions and retirement bills introduced in the 50 state legislatures and the District of Columbia from the beginning of 2009 until March 4, 2009. The goal of the report is to convey a sense of the major issues under consideration in the legislatures, not to report every bill. Bills that would affect a narrow class of active or retired employees and housekeeping legislation have been excluded. Bills that affect specific local government retirement plans have been included only when the local system is very large (for example, Chicago public employees) or when the bill addresses all the systems in a state. More attention has been given legislation that affects large groups of system members (like teachers or general state employees) than bills that affect small groups (like forest wardens or lifeguards). The existence of bills identical or similar to those itemized below has been noted as a way of indicating a topic of broad concern in a given legislature.

The legislation is arranged by topic. It should be noted that few pension and retirement bills had been introduced in the legislatures of Massachusetts and Pennsylvania by the time this report was compiled.

This document is based on a search of the NCSL Bill Information Service, which NCSL provides in partnership with State Net as a service to legislators and legislative staff. A number of the State Net bill summaries have been augmented with information drawn directly from state legislatures' bill information service.

Studies disability benefit options for members of the public employees' retirement system plan 2 and plan 3, the teachers' retirement system plan 2 and plan 3, and the school employees' retirement system plan 2 and plan 3; directs the Washington state institute for public policy, with the assistance and support of the office of the state actuary, to study, during the 2009 legislative interim, the options available to the legislature.
